## Rules of the Show

1. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the Exhibitor or his agent
2. The Judges' decision as to merit shall be final and objections on other points must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, on the date of the Show and must be accompanied by a fee of £40. All objections will be decided by the committee and the fee returned only if the objection is upheld.
3. Where age is a qualification, the committee may in any case direct an examination by the V.S. The committee shall hear any submissions by the exhibitor and shall then decide the matter and the decision shall be final.
4. The term 'Executive committee' in these rules means the group consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and three others.
5. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class where there is not sufficient competition or merit, and furthermore no second place prize money will be paid unless there are three or more exhibits and no third place prize money will be paid unless there are five or more exhibits in the class.
6. All cups and perpetual trophies won by exhibitors at the 2016 show must be returned to the Secretary, three weeks prior to the 2018 show. Each recipient must sign a form accepting responsibility for cups and trophies before same are presented at the 2018 show.
7. An animal which is winner of two first prizes will not be eligible to compete in another class unless it is a Qualifier or Championship.
8. The Show Grounds open at 8.00am. Judging commences at the times stated in the schedule.
9. The committee will not be responsible for loss or accident of any kind which may occur to exhibitors, exhibits, visitors, spectators, vehicles, or property of any kind. All exhibitors must have public liability insurance in place, this may be asked for by the show/safety officer.
10. The committee requests exhibitors to send in their entries as early as possible. Horse & Pony Entries taken on Show day will be charged an extra £2.00 per entry.
11. Should any matter arise not provided for in the purview of these rules and regulations, the same shall be referred to the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final, from which there shall be no appeal and entries are only accepted upon these conditions.
12. All foals must be haltered and led in the Show Grounds and during classes.
13. All officials of the show will carry identification badges on their person and will be wearing Hi-Viz jackets.
14. If three or less entries forward in a class only 1st prize money will be paid out.
15. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, postpone or alter the show in the event of unforeseen circumstances occurring. Competitors and stallholder fees paid to the show and cleared through the bank, will be refunded after a deduction 20% has been applied. This deduction is to cover administration costs.

### **Rules & Conditions**

#### Novice Horse

1. The same rider must ride the horse throughout the class.
2. A rider may ride more than one horse in the jumping phase of the competition but will have to choose one horse to complete the remainder of the competition.
3. An open horse cannot compete in Novice class but a Novice horse can compete in an open class.
4. Tack – No brushing or over-reach boots to be worn in showing phase. A running martingale with a snaffle bridle only. Double bridle may be worn. The same tack must be worn throughout all phases. Appropriate B.S.I standard headgear to be worn by rider.
5. Novice class is restricted to horses that have not won £200 in prize money in any Working Hunter class at the date of entry to show.

#### Open Horse

1. Open to horses exceeding 153cms (15HH approx.)
2. The same rider must ride the horse throughout the class.
3. A rider may ride more than one horse in the jumping phase of the competition but will have to choose one horse to complete the remainder of the competition.
4. An open horse can not compete in Novice class.
5. Brushing boots permitted in jumping phase only. A running martingale with snaffle bridle only. Double bridle may be used. Same tack must be worn in all phases.
6. No Grade A show jumping or advanced event horses may compete.
7. Clean & properly fitting tack must be worn in all phases.
8. Excessive use of stick or crop will be penalised.

## 'Course'

The course shall consist of 8 to 12 jumping elements. It shall have a combination of upright and spread fences and may include a double, treble or bonus fence. The fences shall be natural in type with copious sensible filling and not be easily dislodged. Only natural poles may be used. A small gate, water tray or stile fence may be included. The maximum height of fences shall not exceed 85cms (Novice) 1m 15cms (Open).

## Judging Phase

Jumping: Each horse will be required to jump the course. To be judged 60% for jumping (40% for jump and 20% for style). Judges will take into account the overall style of the jumping and each fence will be taken into consideration. The approach take off, jump, landing and departure from each fence will be assessed.

Ride: The judge may ride all horses in all paces on either or both reins. The judge may jump horse over a fence.

Confirmation & Movement: The conformation and movement of horse in hand will be assessed by judge.
